### Testing Week

Most of the children have now completed their formal testing which was carried out last week. There are still a few catch-ups happening at present. Next week members of our staff will join with teachers from our other cluster schools to spend a day moderating our writing results to ensure consistency across all our schools. Once marking is completed, teachers then make a decision or Overall Teacher Judgement (**OTJ**) as to whether the child meets the **National Standard** in a particular subject or not. The actual test or writing sample is only part of the judgement the child receives. All their work through the years is considered and used as evidence to back up assessment results.

### Health Consultation coming up 17<sup>th</sup> November at 6.30pm

We are required by the **Ministry of Education** to consult with our school community every two years about how we deliver the **Health Curriculum**. This can be through survey or parent meeting. This year we are inviting all parents to school on the evening of 17<sup>th</sup> November to learn about what we do and be given the opportunity to ask questions or seek clarification about our Health programme. ## All Saints' Day



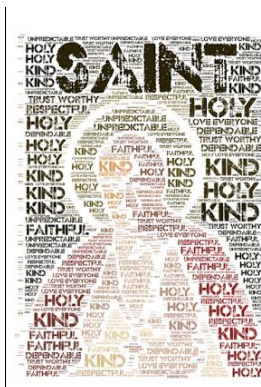
